Reports

<u>Highway Superintendent</u>, Kris Scullion reports that things are going well. We used 10 containers and 2 metal containers at the Clean-up. It went well. I've been watching the 10 day forecast, it may go down in the 30's. We have a couple trucks done for winter and we have been working on culverts.

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<u>Code Enforcement Officer</u>, Kevin Zieres reports that we had a pretty busy month, and I expect a couple more houses this fall. The Junk Yard may not make the dead line, but we are keeping an eye on it and we lost a house to fire in the Town this week.

Public Comment on Agenda Items:

Public comments on agenda items included if the appointed advisory committee has been contacted about the project by the water plant, if tonight is the night the public gets to ask questions on the budget, and the tax maps cannot be accessed on the web-site for the Town.

Business Items

Jeff Siegel founder of the Bagel Festival was present to talk about the bagel festival for next year on August 17, 2014 and invite the Towns to go on the web-site and to come to the festival next year to promote their Towns and what they have to offer.

David Bodenstein, representing Mike Preis Insurance was here to present the Town with a check in the amount of \$1,185.50, for the return of the interest for the Capital Program.

On a motion by Councilman Fuchs, seconded by Councilman Kuebler to set November 11, 2013 @ 6:45pm as the date for the Budget Workshop. Motion Passed - 5 Ayes.

On a motion by Councilman Schadt, seconded by Councilman Fuchs to set November 11, 2013 @ 7:15pm as the date for the Public Hearing for the 2014 Budget. Motion Passed - 5 Ayes.

On a motion by Councilman Kuebler, seconded by Councilman Gaebel to allow the Town Clerk to advertise that the Town of Callicoon Town Clerk's Office will be open on November 15, 2013 until 6:00pm for Hunting Licenses. Motion Passed - 5 Ayes.

The Supervisor gave an update on the Youngsville Water District Project. The bid was awarded to Brett Erdman and he has started the work. He would of been done but he was waiting on the trusses so he should be done by the end of the month.

On a motion by Councilman Kuebler, seconded by Councilman Schadt to go with a one year agreement with the Rouis & Company proposal for a certified review in the amount of \$5,500.00, with an option for an Audit in the amount of \$7,500.00. Motion Passed - 5 Ayes.

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There was a discussion on the old Gradall that we advertised for sale, no bids were received. They

decided to wait and see what happens. They also discussed the new Gradall. Kris Scullion,

Highway Superintendent is happy with the purchase.
