Reports

<u>Highway Superintendent</u>, Kris Scullion reported a good November, they have been cutting brush, and using the wood stove, they have been getting proposals to replace the F550 truck, lowest price was a 2011 left over at Robert Greens in Monticello. They discussed the proposals, buying the truck, body, chassis, and plow from one vendor which makes it easier for repairs.

RES #27-2011, on a motion by Councilman Fuchs, seconded by Councilman Schadt to approve the purchase of 2011 leftover 550 Truck at Robert Green in the amount of 53,141.23. Motion Passed - 5 Ayes.

<u>Code Enforcement Officer</u>, Kevin Zieres reports that things are still busy, there is a new modular up in Shandelee, and possibly another one started, and they completed 13 hours of Continuing Education this month.

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Public Comment on Agenda Items - No Comment.

Business Items

There was a discussion on the Multi-Municipal Task Force (MMTF) that included several members of the board attended the meeting last week and they have not received the final GEIS. Once they receive it a Public Hearing will be set at a later date.

There was a discussion on health care policies and a possible buy back program.

They announced the Sign-up dates for the Winter Youth Basketball Program. It is posted on the web-site and on the bulletin board at the Town Hall.

RES#28-2011, on a motion by Councilman Fuchs, seconded by Councilman Gaebel to allow the year end transfers. Motion Passed - 5 Ayes

RES#29-2011, on a motion by Councilman Kuebler, seconded by Councilman Gaebel to create a Special Reserve fund account to be used toward the amount to be raised in taxes in 2013 in the amount of \$11,323.00. Motion Passed - 5 Ayes.

Open Floor

Discussions included looking into a Veterans Memorial at the Town Park and to include Volunteer Fire and EMS personnel, a Congratulations to Elected Officials and to the effort to all the candidates that ran, contacting the historical society on the history with regard to Veterans for the future memorial, submitting a plan for the memorial, insurance buyouts and what other Towns do, splitting health care, retired health care benefits and active employee benefits, annual buyouts, full time and part time employees, percentage town pays for insurance, buyouts may be disadvantage, savings on buyouts, list of insured, union employees and benefits, giving a 30 day notice of the Public Hearing of the MMTF, using balance of the highway fund, update on the Comprehensive Plan, purpose of the Comprehensive Plan, Public Workshop on the Comprehensive Plan, time frame on the Comprehensive Plan, proposing a new survey for the Comprehensive Plan and rewording the survey, propose ways to re-survey at no expense to the Town, gas drilling, Comprehensive Plan being a guideline not a law, future plans, survey and wishes of residents,

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gas leases, pamphlet on gas drilling, tax base for the Town due to drilling, possible water testing at

the Cooperative Extension, controversial subject of gas drilling, zoning for development in place,

continue to be aware of both aspects of drilling, visiting drill sights, speaking with those involved

in drilling, and articles on drilling.
